

Topics in Clinical Medicine 3 Exam

The Topics in Clinical Medicine 3 exam will be held/delivered in **June 2022**.

The exam will include multiple-choice questions from the five Vertically Integrated Curricula (VIC):

End of Life
Point of Care Ultrasound
Prevention and Screening
Quality and Patient Safety
Radiology

Students are provided Objectives for each VIC exam to guide their studies and they are available on the individual VIC websites on LUMEN, as are resources for preparation for the exams.

Students must PASS each individual VIC exam with a score of at least 70% in order to pass the Topics in Medicine 3 course and meet the criteria for graduation.

Radiology Exam:

*The Radiology exam will be via a traditional “closed book” format which will be delivered in the sit-down labs on **Wednesday, June 8, 2022 at 2:00 pm.***

If the Radiology Exam is not passed on June 8, students will be required to prepare for and pass a written remediation exam on **Friday, June 24, 2022.**

End of Life, Point of Care Ultrasound, Prevention/Screening and Quality/Patient Safety:

The End of Life, Point of Care Ultrasound, Prevention/Screening and Quality/Patient Safety exams will be individual online open-book exams accessible **on the PCM 3 site, in Sakai, from 3:00 pm on Wednesday, June 8, 2022 until 5 pm on Thursday, June 16, 2022.**

Each of the VIC exams must be completed and components will be graded separately. Once an individual exam is accessed on Sakai, students will have 30 minutes to complete that exam.

If an individual VIC exam is not passed by **June 16**, students will be required to repeat the VIC exam on the PCM 3 site in Sakai. The exam will be available from **12 pm on Friday, June 17, 2022 until 11:59pm on Friday, June 24, 2022.**

If any VIC exam or exams are not successfully passed **by June 24, 2022**, a grade of “Incomplete” will be given for the Topics in Medicine-3 course until successful remediation of the failed exam(s) by **August 26, 2022**. The remediation exams will be administered electronically through Sakai.

If any VIC exam or exams are not successfully remediated by **August 26**, this will result in a “Fail” for TCM-3. The student will have the “Fail” grade appear on their transcript until they successfully remediate and pass the failed VIC exam(s), at which time the grade on the transcript will become P*.

Failure to make timely arrangements to sit for the remediation exam(s) will result in a “Concern” for the Professionalism Competency.
