	<ul> <li>MacNeal Off-Site Lot, located at 2900 S. East Ave. at Janura Park. Parking is free of cost.</li> <li>It is about a 20-minute walk from the offsite lot to the MacNeal campus.</li> </ul>				
Reporting Time & Location	General Surgery: arrive by 5:45 a.m. at MacNeal Hospital at 3249 South Oak Park Ave. Entrance A (emergency room entrance) is only public entrance open at that time. However, your ID badge should give you access to any of the other entrances listed on the campus map. Please report to the Surgery call room located in the Hospital, south building, 4th floor. On the door there's a sign that says Resident Suite, the Surgery call room is inside there. The code to enter the suite is 23791 and the code to enter the surgery room is 50376. There you will meet the Surgery Senior Resident.				
	Vascular Surgery: A day before your rotation begins please text your preceptor, Dr. Matthew Blecha (phone # 773-391-8744), to know what time and where to report to on your first day.				
Orientation & Badge	Site specific operating room (OR) orientation is mandatory for all students. This is typically scheduled at 9 AM on the students' first day. Adriana will confirm with you a week in advance details about OR orientation and that your SSOM ID badge has MacNeal campus access. For any ID access issues please contact her.
