
- What anatomic structure is being scanned?

- Does gain need to be adjusted?


Neck Scanning Protocol

- Patient Positioning
 - Supine (Anterior neck)
 - Head turned to the opposite side (Lateral neck)
- Probe Selection
 - Linear
- Technique
 - Transverse plane









Anatomy Refresher - Thyroid Cartilage





Anatomic Landmarks - Laryngeal Prominence








Anatomy Refresher - Lateral Neck










Overview of Lateral Neck Structures
